and sometimes even their lives in jeopardy black activists negotiated protested and demonstrated to create opportunities for the generations that followed The enrichments these change agents made endure in the diversity initiatives and activism surrounding issues of race that exist in the modern Ivy League Upending the Ivory Tower not only informs the civil rights and Black Power movements of the postwar era but also provides critical context for the Black Lives Matter movement that is growing in the streets and on campuses throughout the country today As higher education continues to be a catalyst for change there is no one better to inform today s activists than those who transformed our country s past and paved the way for its future
