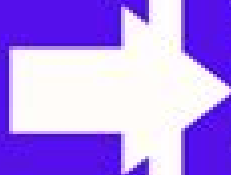
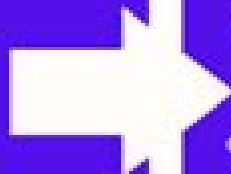
Dyslexia Only Affects Reading

While some individuals with dyslexia might struggle with organisation, it is not a defining characteristic. Many dyslexic individuals are highly organised and use systems to manage their work effectively.

Dyslexia varies in severity. While some individuals may struggle significantly with reading, others may read but at a slower pace or with more difficulty. Many people with dyslexia can and do read successfully with the right strategies and support.
