Horst argues that this calls for a complete re thinking of the contemporary problematic in philosophy of mind Reductionism dualism eliminativism and non reductive materialism are each severely compromised by post reductionist philosophy of science and philosophy of mind is in need of a new paradigm Horst suggests that such a paradigm might be found in Cognitive Pluralism the view that human cognitive architecture constrains us to understand the world through a plurality of partial idealized and pragmatically constrained models each employing a particular representational system optimized for its own problem domain Such an architecture can explain the disunities of knowledge and is plausible on evolutionary grounds
